Congratulations Isabella Fridia! Fridia was crowned Jr. Miss Indian Oklahoma City on Friday, March 17, 2017. Isabella, along with other contestants, were required to give a tribal introduction, model and explain tribal regalia, and perform a traditional talent. Isabella was mentored by Miss Sydney Prince for the pageant and spent many weeks to prepare. She credits much of her Wichita language knowledge to learning from Grandma Doris, President Terri Parton, and Gary McAdams over the years.

Fridia is grounded in traditional spiritual ways and her culture. She is a scholar who takes Pre-AP Math and Science courses at Southridge Jr. High in Moore, OK. She is an athlete who runs Cross Country and Track for her school. She is a member of the Native American Student Association, a Student Council Officer, and a member of the Book Club. Her true passion is gymnastics. She trains 20 hours a week at Bart Conner Gymnastics Academy and hopes to one day make it to the Olympics. Currently Miss Isabella is in America's Top 100 for Level 6 Bars and Vault.

She is an exceptional role model for not only the Wichita people, but other tribal communities.

Her parents are Brandon and Tasha Fridia. Grandmother is Suzanne Wise. Her great grandmother was the late Frances Wise. She is proud to represent her family, the Wichita people, and the Changing Winds Organization.



Tribal Member Receives Outstanding Native American Athlete Award at the 2017 Greater Tulsa Indian Art Festival

On Premiere Night, February 10, Dane Evans (Wichita) received the Outstanding Native American Athlete Award at the 30th Anniversary Scholarship Benefit Gala Dinner.

Dane Evans (Wichita): 2016 University of Tulsa graduate & TU Quarterback. Miami Beach Bowl MVP, Team Offensive MVP, Allstate's 2016 Good Works Team Member, All time TU leader in completions, attempts, passing yards, passing TD's, and total yards. Started 44 of 46 career games. Threw for 11,680 yards and 84 touchdowns in his career at Tulsa.

Dane is represented by the prestigious sports agent Leigh Steinberg, and Chris Cabott, and recently participated in a Pro Day for the 2017 NFL Draft. Dane graduated from Tulsa in the Spring of 2016 with a degree in Exercise and Sports Science and Education with a minor in Sports Management.

Dane plans to play football either in the NFL or the Canadian Football league and then coach at the collegiate level. President’s Report March Edition By Terri Parton, President Submitted April 6, 2017

It’s Spring. Beautiful time of the year. With the change of the season, there has been a lot of change in staff here at the Tribe. We look forward to getting things back on track and getting a newspaper out to our tribal members. This newspaper is intended to get things caught up and as much information out to you as possible to update you on things that have been going on and upcoming events. I will spend more time in the April 2017 newspaper updating you in more detail on some of the projects that we are finishing up such as the Wichita Tribal History Center and the Hinton Travel Inn but for now here are a few brief updates.

Wichita Tribal History Center

The Wichita and Affiliated Tribes has received a letter of substantial completion for the Wichita Tribal History Center building. There is still some minor touchups that need to be completed by the contractor in regards to the actual building but it is substantially complete. The exhibits are still being worked on. Some of the display cases have arrived and work is being completed on the display panels. We will be looking for an actual opening of the Wichita Tribal History Center sometime this summer.

Hinton Travel Inn

The Hinton Travel Inn renovations continue. The second floor has been completed. The remaining 12 rooms on the first floor

will be completed in the next few weeks. The lobby will then be renovated.

Tribal Member Health Plan

The Tribal Member Health Plan renewed again on January 1, 2017. The benefits remain the same as 2016. The burial assistance is being processed by the Tribe. If you have not received your card, then please contact (405) 247-2425 and request an application. All questions regarding benefits should be directed to Native Care Health. We hope to have some more information on the Tribal Member Health Plan, including some statistics, in the next newspaper.

BIA Budget Formulation Meeting

On November 28, 2016, the Oklahoma City Area Indian Health Service convened to discuss the FY-2019 Budget Formulation Process and to develop a budget for the National Budget work session. President Bruce Pratt, Pawnee Nation, and I were selected to be the Oklahoma City Area Representatives at the National Budget work session in Washington, DC in February 2017. The Oklahoma City Area Indian Health Service consists of 43 tribes with 38 of those being in Oklahoma, 4 in Kansas and 1 in Texas. The Oklahoma City Area is the lowest funded IHS Area per capita with 355,435 user population in FY-2015. The Oklahoma City Area Budget Formulation top priorities were: 1) Purchased and Referred Care (PRC) 2) Level of Need Funding 3) Behavioral Health and Substance Abuse 4) Hospitals and Clinics 5) Dental Health 6) Facilities that includes Maintenance, Infrastructure, Equipment and Injury Prevention 7) Prevention

including Health Education and CHR’s 8) Urban Facilities 9) Health Professions. Some of the Hot Topics Presented in the Narrative of Budget Priorities included: Preservation of the Indian Health Care Improvement Act (IHCIA), Sequestration, Medicaid Reform and the Indian Health System, Sanitation Deficiency System, SDPI Permanent Funding, Reducing the CHEF threshold, Construction Beyond the Priority List and Mandatory Contract Support Costs.

The Oklahoma City Area’s budget recommendations all were included in the top recommendations at the National Budget Formulation Meeting. Also, during the meeting a motion was made to include language requesting that Direct Service Tribes, such as the Lawton Service Unit, and Headquarters be given the same flexibility as Self-Governance Tribes. This was a great experience and I learned a lot more on the budget formulation process and how it is important for tribal leaders from the Lawton Inter-Tribal Health Board to be involved in the budget formulation process to fight for those things that will benefit our tribal people that utilize the Lawton, Anadarko and Carnegie facilities.

Conclusion

Things have been slow. We will be completing the Hinton Travel Inn and Wichita Tribal History Center soon. I am hoping the Committee will come together and get other projects such as the planning and development of the Hinton Properties moving. The first year of this first term has not seen a lot of progress. When you compare the movement to the first year of the last term it has been extremely slow.

Things take time but we have to be moving to work on the bigger projects so that we don’t remain stagnant. We have to take chances and realize that everything will not always be perfect. You move things by stepping out and taking calculated chances. As we complete the first 9 months of the first year, I hope that we begin to seriously work on planning over the next three months so that year two moves the Tribe towards bigger things. We must also support our youth activities to ensure that we have good leaders to step in to take our place in tribal leadership. We had a council meeting in February and it made me happy to see all the interns that returned to take part in their government. That’s our future. Hopefully, one day soon on of them will step up and take my place as tribal leader. That should always be our goal to teach those younger than us to become leaders. Pray that our Tribe remains stable, that all leadership looks at the bigger picture and makes good decisions for our future but aren’t afraid to take chances, and that our people continue to be taken care of to the best of our ability. May the Creator bless us all.

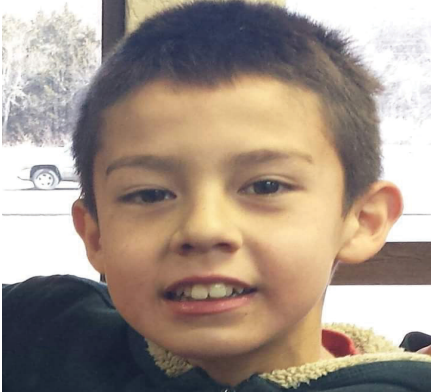
National Honor Society welcomes a new member

ACCOUNTANTS' COMPILATION REPORT

Management is responsible for the accompanying financial statements of Wichita and Affiliated Tribes, which comprise the balance sheet – Governmental Funds of the Wichita and Affiliated Tribes as of December 31, 2016, and the related statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balance –Governmental Funds for the fiscal period to date ended December 31, 2016, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We have performed a compilation engagement in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services promulgated by the Accounting and Review Services Committee of the AICPA. We did not audit or review the financial statements nor were we required to perform any procedures to verify the accuracy or completeness of the information provided by management. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion, a conclusion, nor provide any form of assurance on these financial statements and supplementary schedules.

The financial statements do not present governmental fund balance based on the appropriate level of constraints imposed upon the use of these funds in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States require governmental fund balances to be classified in a hierarchy based primarily on the extent to which a government is bound to observe constraints imposed upon the use of the resources reported in governmental funds. The effects of this departure from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States on these financial statements and supplementary schedules have not been determined.

The governmental financial statements are not adjusted for deferred inflows created due to period of availability. Because the financials are issued in the month following the end of the fiscal period to date, it is not practicable to determine the amount of grant receivables that will be received in the Tribe's one year period of availability. The effects of this departure from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States on these financial statements and supplementary schedules have not been determined.

Management has elected to omit substantially all the disclosures ordinarily included in financial statements prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States. If the omitted disclosures were included in the financial statements and supplementary schedules, they might influence the user's conclusion about Wichita and Affiliated Tribe's assets, liabilities, net position, revenues, and expenses. Accordingly, these financial statements are not designed for those who are not informed about such matters.

Required Supplementary Information

Management has omitted the required supplementary information, Management Discussion and Analysis and Budgets that accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require to be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such missing information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by GASB who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context.

Supplementary Information

The supplementary information contained on tab's 1 thru 12 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. This information is the representation of management. The information was subject to our compilation engagement, however, we have not audited or reviewed the supplementary information and accordingly, do not express an opinion, a conclusion, nor provide any form of assurance on such supplementary information. This supplementary information is subject to the applicable modifications discussed in the paragraphs above.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Wichita and Affiliated Tribes Executive Committee, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

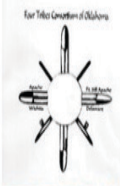

Community Building Rental Procedures

- Receptionist in Administration takes the information.
- Requests for verbal approval from Administration if the activity/event is allowable.
- Calendar is check to make sure the date requested is available.
- Activity/Event goes on the calendar.
- Tribal Member pays \$50 for the rental and \$50 for the deposit.
- This must be two money orders.
- Accounting Liaison will give instructions on how to complete the money orders.
- Accounting Liaison gives receipt.
- Tribal Member makes arrangements to pick up key at the front desk as activity/event draws near.
- Tribal Member must bring back the keys before the deposit is given back to them.
- Receptionist will send an email to President, Tribal Administrator, Administrative Assistant, Accounting Liaison and Maintenance Supervisor notifying them of the date the building has been reserved, who is utilizing the building and the purpose.
- Administrative Assistant will once again verify that the event is on the calendar.
- Maintenance staff will place on their calendar to make sure that the building is set up for the activity/event.
- Other than Graduation, only one tribal member should be able to schedule the building in a day. Tribal Members do not have to pay on the days set aside for graduations for Riverside, Gracemont and Anadarko but must share the building space with other graduate receptions.
- Non-tribal members are not allowed to utilize the building.
- Wichita Little Sisters, Wichita Young Men’s Society and Wichita Service Club are authorized to utilize the building without charge.
- Programs have to pay the rental fee unless it is during the day from the hours of 8:00 am to 5:00 pm.
- Receptionist will go over the checklist with them when they pick up the application. Accounting Liaison will go over the checklist with them again and have them initial by each requirement when they bring in the deposit. We want to ensure that they read it and don’t just sign it.
- Maintenance Supervisor will notify the Accounting Liaison and Receptionist by email once the building has been checked to confirm that the deposit can be returned to the tribal member.
- The application has other requirements that must be met.
